• Enrolment/Attendance: The kindergarten has continued to increase in the number of enrolments over the past few years due to increase of housing developments in our catchment area. Currently the kindergarten reaches its physical capacity at 66 children each term. We offer the equivalent of 15 hours per week (600hours over a year) of government funded preschool for children in their eligible year, that is the year before school entry.

Our kindergarten is provided through the running of 2 sessional groups over a week. The Rosella Group attend each week on a Monday and Tuesday 8:30am-3:00pm, and alternate Wednesday 8:30am-1: 30pm. The Turtle group attend each week on a Thursday and Friday, and alternating Wednesdays 8:30am-1:30pm. No children attend the last two Wednesday sessions of each term due to longer operating hours on other weeks.).

• **Co-located/stand-alone:** The kindergarten is a stand-alone site, situated on the north side of the Moana Primary school grounds. The kindergarten has opportunity to access school facilities like the school oval, gym facilities, library, and hall.

Speech and Languague Screeners are conducted to support the identification, referral, and establishment of support for children with oral language difficulties.

# 3. Curriculum

## Framework used: Early Years Learning Framework

The Early Years Learning Framework for Australia. `Belonging, Being and Becoming' curriculum (including the Department for Education Indicators for Literacy and Numeracy) is developed in partnership with staff and children through a play-based learning program. It has a specific emphasis on play-based learning and recognises the importance of communication and language, children's wellbeing, and social and emotional development. Our team aims to provide a high quality teaching and learning program within the context of the National Quality Framework for Early Childhood Education and Care.



### Philosophy:

Each child will access a quality learning environment which is inclusive, accessible, and equitable and play based. Each child is encouraged to develop a growth mindset, self-concept and enthusiasm for learning while being supported in their individual learning. The kindergarten will encourage and support the involvement of families and the community, while respecting and valuing their needs and expectations. Staff will provide quality teaching and learning experiences for all children which are current, research based and authentic. Environmentally sustainable practices are imbedded.

### Special Curriculum Projects

Beach Kindy Program.

In 2018 Moana Kindergarten collaboarated with Nature Play SA to evolve their regular excursions to the local Moana Beach into a fully integrated Beach Kindy Program, running within their sessional preschool hours. As a community they developed the Beach Kindy Handbook and Parent Handbook with required policies and procedures to support the preschool children and staff to further explore their local community.

The Beach Kindy program is currently included in our Term 2 and 3 preschool programs on our shorter alternating Wednesdays 8:30-1:30pm from weeks 1-8. The learning, discoveries and inquiries that evolve through our beach program are intentional extended upon during the children's sessions at the Moana Kindy site to further extend their understanding and knowledge around their local community, caring for the environment and sustainability practices.

## 5. Centre Facilities

### Buildings and grounds

The centre was established in 1983, and has a well maintained indoor and outdoor space, which children access concurrently throughout their day.

The outdoor space was reflected upon and redeveloped over many years to be a natural space complemented with native trees and plants, a frog pond, a sensory and butterfly garden, flowers, and wicking beds for edible plants. These areas are cared for by the staff, children, and a local gardener. In 2020 we constructed a larger pergola area fitted with outdoor blinds, heaters, lights, and fans to enlarge our undercover areas.

Our indoor environment consists of two large spaces separated by concerntina folding doors that include smaller areas created by furtniture and resources to support the learning, and developmental needs of our children. Currently this includes spaces for quiet time and regulation, meeting area/s, large block construction space and tabletop experiences throughout.

# 6. Local Community (intended for country preschools)

#### General characteristics:

Moana Kindergarten is an outer costal suburb siutatued in the established residental community area of Seaford, within the City of Onkaparina Council. Over the past few years, we have seen a large residential growth in our region due to an increase of afforbale living and housing developments in the south of our catchment area.

We are located just a short distance from Commercial Road (400m walk) and our local Moana Beach (1.0km away) resulting in a strong beach culture in our community.

## Parent and community involvement in the preschool

Many parents are in the paid work force and a high proportion of our children have both parents in full or part time work or undertaking study.

We have a small but active Governing Council. Families support staff through involvement in the curriculum and by assisting with a variety of tasks (volunteers for our Beach Kindy Program, reading books, odd jobs, working bees, etc.), they are very involved in excursions and events throughout the year.

### Schools to which children generally transfer from this preschool

The centre has children transitioning to several different government or catholic educational settings within our local and wider community. The main feeder schools are Moana Primary School, and All Saints Catholic Primary School.

Various private childcare centres (i.e. Greenleaves ELC and Goodstart ELC)

#### Commercial/industrial and shopping facilities

The centre is located with walking distance of multiple playgrounds, large grass areas, community places and nearby shopping facilities such as:

- Seford Central that encompasses multiple supermarkets, a post office, chemist, and other shopping facilities.
- The Onkaparinga Seaford Library
- Seaford Community Centre (playgroup and community garden)
- Moana Surf Life Saving Club and Moana Beach Caravan Park



#### Other local facilities

Public transport is available in Seaford on Commercial Road and Esplande (approx. 400m walk) and Seaford Railway Station (1.0km walk), with direct routes to Noarlunga Colonnades Shopping Centre and the Adelaide CBD.
